DALLAS (SEPT. 23, 2025) – As part of the countdown to its Centennial Celebration, United Way of Metropolitan Dallas will host its annual STEM Fest 2025, presented by Comerica Bank and Mr. Cooper Group, on Tuesday, Sept. 23, at the Perot Museum of Nature and Science. The event is part of the Aspire United Volunteer Series, presented by Texas Instruments. Hundreds of middle school and elementary school students will participate in a full day of hands-on activities, demonstrations, and learning opportunities focused on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM), with FC Dallas legend Kenny Cooper Jr. and mascot Tex Hooper joining volunteers to engage and inspire the students.

STEM Fest immerses students and volunteers in dynamic, interactive experiences that spark curiosity, fuel imaginations and showcase real-world STEM career pathways. The program is designed to help prepare students for success beyond high school, ensuring they are equipped for well-paying jobs in high-demand fields.

"Sparking an interest in STEM is just one way United Way of Metropolitan Dallas and our partners are working together to prepare the next generation of innovators," said Jennifer Sampson, McDermott-Templeton President & CEO of United Way of Metropolitan Dallas. "When students are ready for success after high school, they are more likely to achieve financial stability, access quality health care and support their children's success in school. STEM Fest is an important part of how we drive meaningful progress toward our mission to improve education, income and health across North Texas."

This year's STEM Fest will welcome approximately **500 fifth and sixth grade students from Duncanville ISD**, including Fairmeadows Elementary, Hastings Elementary and Kennemer Middle School.

"In every classroom today sits the minds who will shape our tomorrow—future engineers, scientists and doctors waiting to be inspired," said Andy Smith, TI director of Giving and Volunteering. "Through STEM Fest and our enduring partnership with United Way of Metropolitan Dallas, we're not just teaching concepts—we're sparking curiosity, building confidence, and opening young eyes to what's possible in STEM careers."

Volunteers from across the region will guide students through activities, mentor them in STEM pathways, and share career insights. Students will test their skills with TI robotics and drones, engage in prompt engineering used for AI, investigate chemical changes as Chemistry Detectives, and explore insect adaptations in the immersive Bug Lab Exhibit.
