

The North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, The National Soccer Roots, U.S. Soccer Foundation and The City of Lake Dallas Unveil Mini-Pitch at Lake Dallas City Park

DALLAS (December 18, 2025) - The North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, in partnership with The National Soccer Roots, the U.S. Soccer Foundation and The City of Lake Dallas, today unveiled its first mini-pitch at Lake Dallas City Park. The donation of the mini-pitch is the first of six during the first phase that is planned across North Texas before, during and after FIFA World Cup 2026™ as part of the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee's Legacy initiatives. The North Texas FWC Organizing Committee has plans to create five additional mini-pitches spread across Dallas, Fort Worth, Arlington and Garland.

Lake Dallas City leaders, partners and community members gathered today to celebrate the unveiling of the mini-pitch at Lake Dallas City Park, which also included a ribbon-cutting ceremony and the "first kick" on the mini-pitch with local participating youth.

"It's such an honor to partner with The City of Lake Dallas, The National Soccer Roots and the U.S. Soccer Foundation and commemorate a special day for the youth of North Texas with the unveiling of our first mini-pitch," said Monica Paul, President of the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee. "Through our legacy and fundraising initiatives during and after FIFA World Cup 2026, we are aiming to create additional mini-pitches spread across the North Texas region to bring the sport of soccer to underserved youth in our local communities."

The Lake Dallas City Park mini-pitch will provide local children and families a high-quality facility and space to equal soccer and play for all youth in the surrounding area.

"The unveiling of this mini-pitch at Lake Dallas City Park is a proud moment for our city and a meaningful investment in our young people," said Kristy Bleau, Mayor of Lake Dallas. "By partnering with the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, The National Soccer Roots and the U.S. Soccer Foundation, we are creating a welcoming space that promotes health, teamwork and opportunity for our families. This mini-pitch represents more than a place to play - it reflects our commitment to building a stronger, more connected community for generations to come."

"We are thrilled to welcome the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee and this incredible legacy project to our community, as the launch of this mini-pitch represents far more than a field," said Bobbie Mitchell, Denton County Commissioner. "It is an investment in our youth, our neighborhoods, and the future of soccer in North Texas. We are proud to partner in an effort that will inspire young people and serve our youth for generations to come. This project reflects the power of partnership and the lasting impact we can create when we invest in our children, our families, and the joy of the game. We are excited for what this means for Lake Dallas and all of North Texas."

A mini-pitch is a hard-surface soccer court, roughly a quarter of the size of a regulation-sized soccer field, designed for small-sided matches and informal pick-up games, usually enclosed by fencing or low barriers. Mini-pitches serve as vibrant gathering spaces, are typically open to community access and are usually owned and maintained by schools,

parks or nonprofits while providing equity in play that eliminates barriers of cost and travel for families.

"Soccer isn't just a game - it's a bridge. A ball builds futures, and a pitch builds unity," said Jim Wagner, President / Co-Founder, The National Soccer Roots. "It's an honor to partner on this mini-pitch with the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, the U.S. Soccer Foundation and The City of Lake Dallas who all share our vision of championing initiatives that prioritize human rights, inclusivity and youth development that will lay the groundwork for organizations like ours to thrive."

"This mini-pitch represents the heart of our mission - to ensure every child has a place to play and grow through the game of soccer, and a place to connect with a caring and trained coach-mentor," said Ed Foster-Simeon, President & CEO of the U.S. Soccer Foundation. "We're honored to partner with the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, The National Soccer Roots, The City of Lake Dallas to ensure the tournament has a positive impact for generations to come across the region."
